The Priest's Desk

Greetings Sisters and Brothers in Christ!

Soon we will once again hear the glorious proclamations of "Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia! He is risen! As we enter into the end of our season of Lent and into the season of Easter, let us take a moment to pause.

Pause and reflect on who we are and what we are called to be. The season of spring is one of my favorite seasons as we begin to feel the warmth of the sun and the flowers begin breaking through the ground, trees start to bud and we just all feel better. It is a time of new life.

First, we must pause to reflect on the profound sacrifice of Jesus Christ. Jesus chose to die on the cross for each and every one of us. Such is his great love for us. Jesus died for our sins and through his cross and blood, we are a redeemed people.

Before we jump ahead to the glory of Easter, we must remember that Jesus first spent 3 days in hell, fighting for us, for those who have come before us, and for those who will come after us. Jesus overcame the power of sin and death.

Each day, we must choose between sin and righteousness, between life and death. The mystery of the crucifixion must always be at the forefront of who we are and who we are to become.

Just as spring brings forth new life, we are called to enter into our relationship with God more deeply. We must die to self and to sin and choose the path that Jesus has created for us. We must reject evil in all forms and choose love, compassion and justice for all.

We cannot pretend that our world is okay. We must face the realities before us, encouraged in our faith that God is with us. Emmanuel. The same Jesus that was born in a manger is the same Jesus that was raised from the dead. Jesus created a path for us and we must choose that path daily.

Death and life. That is our destiny. If we were to die today, could we say that we loved as Jesus loves us? Could we say that we have fed the poor with good things? Clothed the naked? Given shelter to the stranger at our door? Cared for not just what is important for us, but cared for what is important for the good of the whole of creation? Have we taken steps to care for our earth?

We are all the Body of Christ. As St. Paul in his Second Letter to the Corinthians reminds us, "From now on, we regard no one from a human point of view." Do we look for Jesus in the face of those whom we fear? The trans kid trying to figure out who they are. The pregnant teen that was raped but has decided to carry the child. The immigrant fleeing violence and war. The Muslim neighbor who just wants to worship in the way that is best for them? The hungry child in our public schools that has no food at home, that gets their only sustenance at school. The Democrat? The Republican?

It is easy for us to call ourselves Christians. We are thrilled that Jesus died for us and that we have forgiveness through the blood of his cross. But are we confident in our belief that Jesus died for those mentioned above.

My friends, we don't have to understand one another in order to be respectful. But if we don't look for the face of Jesus in every person, we are failing in our mission to serve Christ in one another.

During this season of new birth, let us put away the darkness of the present times and rise to new life. Let us work for justice for all. This is who we are called to be. Even in our pledge of allegiance, we hear those exact same words. "With liberty and justice for all." All means all. Not just for some, not just for those we might agree with or like or love. All means even those we do not like or understand.

We are called to be the feet, the hands, and the love of the risen Christ. To bring healing and forgiveness. To bring new life to those who feel dead inside. God's love is foreveryone.

May this season of spring and new life, bring you abundant joy, peace and love. May you be so filled with the Holy Spirit that others will see Jesus working through you. May you find your reason for living, in Christ who died for us all.








Easter Brunch Potluck

FOYER GROUPS 2025



For 2025 we are modifying our groups slightly due to attrition and new participants. Of course, we'd like additional participants and would gladly add groups. So, if this is a new concept to you and you ask, what are Foyer Groups...they are small groups of 3-8 persons sharing simple meals and fellowship, usually at the home of one of the members, though sometimes the group may gather at a restaurant or other venue. The intention is to have fun and provide an opportunity for us to meet each other and to become better acquainted. Each group typically meets monthly for a simple meal and relaxed conversation and the meetings typically last two to two and one-half hours. Foyer Groups are not intended to do anything, but simply to be what Christians are: groups of people who gather together and love one another so that friendships may grow. Each month, one of the members hosts a gathering. Foyer Groups are not a study or prayer group and they have no agenda other than spending time with one another, which is important for the building of Christian community in our parish. The uniqueness of the Foyer Group is its lack of formal structure, its openness of communication, and its free access given to the Spirit. Since some of our parishioners no longer drive at night, ride sharing and some daytime meetings are encouraged.
