### FROM THE PRIEST'S DESK



October brings a flood of color into the world. The beautiful tapestry that nature gives us is woven by a God who loves creation very much. This tapestry can remind us of how we are woven together to make something vibrant and beautiful. The colors of the fall season provide a stark contrast to the human condition in our world today.

The news is filled with a lot of negative things going on in the world. Yet, we are people of faith and hope. It is difficult for us to see a time when our world was filled with so much hatred and bias. This isn't the first time and I doubt it will be the last.

Throughout history, people have turned their eyes from God. Almost every single time, people have realized their sins and repented. God, in turn gives them another opportunity. That is our God. The God we profess every Sunday.

The German word for salvation history is Heilsgeschichte. This compound word combines "Heil" (salvation) and "Geschichte" (history or story), and it refers to the theological concept of God's saving actions throughout human history, particularly in the context of the Christian understanding of the Bible. God has not once, abandoned us to the powers of evil and God never will. God loves us way too much. Our God is love in action. God truly wants what is best for us.

It's easy for us to get discouraged by the news. We must always remember the faith we profess. In response to all that is going on in our world, we must respond by telling the Good News of Jesus Christ. We must spread love, joy and peace. Our goal on earth is to find God and make God's presence known here and now. We are to make the Kingdom of God present here and now. Heaven is not some lofty goal. With the help and guidance of the Holy Spirit, we can make heaven known in our world.

The task before us is to follow in the footsteps of Jesus. What did Jesus do? Read the scriptures and study the life of Jesus. Be the hands, the feet, the mouth of Christ to those we encounter.

This is not to say that we should bury our heads in the sand and ignore the world around us. We are often called (as followers of Jesus) to be countercultural. Jesus didn't imitate the negativity. He didn't ignore it. Jesus provided us the template in how we are to respond to whatever is going on around us. Jesus stood up for those who were outcasts. The poor, the hungry, the sick and the stranger. Jesus was about restoring people to God.

We must and can do the same. My advice is to pray, to study scripture, and to listen. Listen to the voice of God. God is searching for those who realize their dependence on God. Our job is to let us be found by God, to be molded by God and to ignore the status quo. To ignore those who make the lives of others difficult and to stand up for justice, peace and love.

It is a daunting task. The church has seen numerous saints rise up over human history. God continues to call us to rise up. Be a voice for positive change. Be a heart that loves unconditionally. Be the voice of reason and hope.

Together, we will make a difference. Remember this. We may not change the world, but we might change the world for one person.




In the Armed Forces and Federal Ministries cycle of prayer, we prayfor our chaplains, military members, their families, and for the following:


